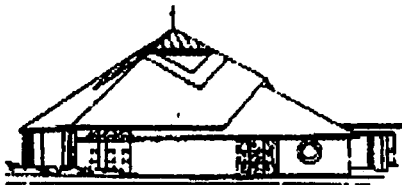

Further to what I wrote in the last Ad Clerum, I would like to recommend to you the following specific guidelines: Emphasise to the community that personal hygiene is of the highest importance – hand washing and using a handkerchief/tissue when sneezing or coughing; holy water stoups should not be used; the sign of peace should be given without a handshake, simply greeting those around us with a nod or a smile; Extraordinary Ministers of Communion should use antibacterial wipes both before and after distributing Communion; the chalice should not be offered and the host only given in the hand. While I leave the implementation of these guidelines to your pastoral judgment, they have been prepared out of particular concern for the vulnerable: namely the elderly, children and those with underlying health problems.

This is granted to all the faithful who, attend Mass & offer prayers to Jesus Christ for the priests of the Church, and offer any other good work which they have done on that day, as long as they have been to sacramental confession and prayed in accordance with the Holy Father's intentions, in honour of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, that priests be preserved in purity and holiness of life.

“Dear Lord and Friend of priests, send daily to all priests the 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit, that they may become all things to all men, in life and in death. Give them patience with the little ones, compassion for the sick, humility with the poor, courage before the enemies of the Church. Make them tireless in teaching, patient and kind in the confessional, generous in the administration of Holy Communion. Let them be messengers of peace to all men of good will. Wherever they go, may Your blessing go with them; wherever they abide, may Your peace enter in. Whoever they bless, may he or she also be blessed by You. Make them apostles, make them saints. Most blessed Virgin Mary, pray for our priests and inspire them with love for your Son. St. John Vianney, pray for us and for all our priests.”
